





I feel connected on campus - whether that is through the Ambassadors Program that allows me to connect with prospective students or chatting with Dr. Carlson. In addition, I work at the St. Luke Child Development Center which shares a building with the Teen Center, so I get to see my mentors on a regular basis, even if it's for a quick hug.
